Board members re-elected to serve another three-year term include: Jim Baehnk, Oscar Mayer Foods Corp.; John

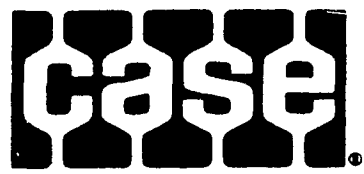

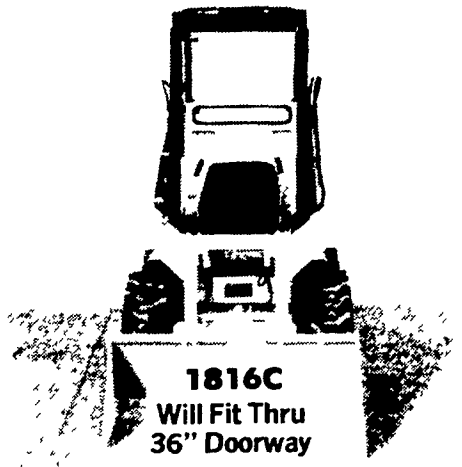
to serve another three-year term.

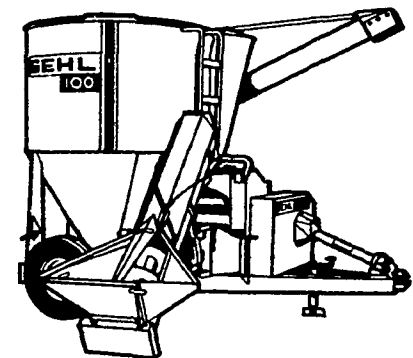
