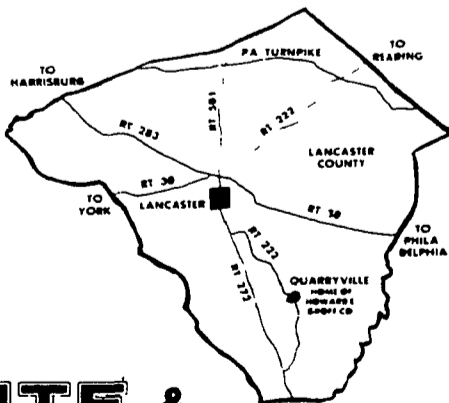

## Md.'s Institute of Applied Agriculture gets funding

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — For the first time since its funding in 1965, the Institute of Applied Agriculture, University of Maryland, will be financially healthy this year, reports Larry N. Vanderhoef, provost, Division of Agricultural and Life Sciences. The Maryland legislature has completed its 1982 activities, and the University of Maryland budget request includes "permanent funding for the IAA beginning in 1982-83," says Vanderhoef.

The Institute of Applied Agriculture is a two-year program with an applied approach to learning. Students prepare for careers in agriculture in these major areas: business farming, ornamental horticulture, and turfgrass management.

From its inception, the Institute has never been fully funded and has been dependent each year on money from other budgets. In 1981, those sources no longer existed, and in April 1981, it was announced that the Institute might have to close.

The public responded to this announcement. Institute students, alumni, their families and friends, vocational agriculture teachers, the Maryland Farm Bureau, Maryland Grange, farmers, numerous turfgrass and horticultural associations and businesses, the Delmarva Farmer,

Maryland Farmer and others voiced a unanimous message: "Keep the IAA alive and vital," Vanderhoef notes.

Foremost supporters of agriculture in Maryland delivered this message to the highest levels, including Governor Harry Hughes, Secretary of Agriculture Wayne Cawley, and legislators.

"This is an important step," says Ronald J. Seibel, director of the Institute. "Continued attention and support from all concerned is essential if the Institute is to reach its full potential in serving the two-year post-secondary education needs of those interested in working in Maryland's agriculture and horticulture industries."

According to Seibel, many people who could benefit from courses and programs offered by the Institute are not aware of the program's existence.

"Program visibility is one of our continuing problems," Seibel says. "We hope business and industry will become more instrumental in increasing public awareness of the Institute program and the numerous career opportunities open to its graduates."

The Institute's new term system — four 8-week terms during the year — provides flexibility for people in industry who may choose to attend courses during the slack season in their occupations.
