the laboratory additions. The new fluorescent antibody microscopes permits more rapid positive diagnoses, thus facilitating earlier treatment of infected flocks. The teaching microscope, which has a second set of eyepieces, helps Odor explain diagnostic methods to University personnel, local students, and poultry flock supervisors In addition, two incubators have been donated to the lab by CEVA Laboratories, Inc.

Another addition is a holding room for birds brought in by poultry service workers. Birds are kept here until Odor can work on each individual case.

According to Ed Ralph, director of the Georgetown substation and executive secretary of the Delmarva Poultry Industry, Odor works closely with the nine Delmarva growout companies in maintaining flock health. He's also working with University poultry researchers in Newark.

"We are extremely proud of our University's poultry disease research team," Ralph says.




