Though Tourette Syndrome is not fatal, there is no known cure for it. Kevin remembers that while the physical effects were minmum for him, the emotional and social scars of having his selfesteem ridiculed were devasting. He credits his 4-H work for its positive effects He stated, "4-H was my savior. The kids there didn't even know I had Tourette. It was under control, but the kids at school still remembered. I could do 4-H activities and be myself.'


