Wednesday's trade turned slow especially on Steers with buyers anticipating the carcass beef prices to trend downward and erase all advance noted the previous week. Majority of receipts mainly Good and Choice Steers and Heifers with average Choice and Prime Steer consignments scarce and poorly tested at midweek. Receipts this week about 2200 compared to 2340 last week and 2918 a year ago.

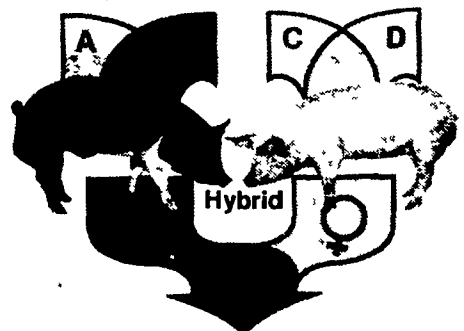
