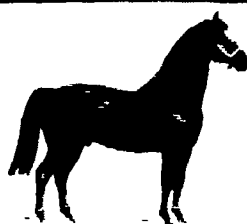

Maintain electric deer fences

UNIVERSITY PARK — University research-
ers are being told by
farmers that Penn State
5-wire electrified fences,
built with high-
tensile wire and special
energizers, are controlling deer damage to
crops

A dozen Commonwealth crop
producers are
cooperating with Penn
State to evaluate new
fence designs and
materials. Funding is
from the Pennsylvania
Department of
Agriculture

In their most recent
survey Robert Wingard

and William Palmer,
project leaders from the
School of Forest
Resources, asked these
farmers about
protection and results
obtained with the test
fences

Several farms have
two years of protection,
but for some growers
last year was the first
year of experience with
the fences. Sites are in
areas with histories of
severe damage by deer
to field crops, fruits,
vegetables, orchards
and Christmas trees

Growers expressed
two key points in their
evaluations of the

fences. Good construction methods,
following intended
design specifications,
can avoid many
problems when fences
are in use. Farmers also
echoed the researcher's
concerns about the
importance of maintenance

Straight lines
minimize strain on posts
and insulators. Long,
straight lines also help
ease certain maintenance
practices such as mowing,
spraying and tilling next
to fences. High-tensile
wire fences must be
built with strong corners
to keep the wire tight

Even with modern
fence components, weed
load can't be ignored

The high voltage,
low-impedance energizers
can handle weed loads
in dry weather, but during
wet periods the same weed
load can drain enough current
to reduce effectiveness,"

says Wingard. Since
top voltage is required
to turn deer, a weed control
program is necessary

The Penn State
specialist adds that
power should be checked
after lightning storms. Safety
modules intended to
protect energizers need
replacing if storms cause
failure," he says.

Periodic recharging of
batteries and checking
for damaged insulators
are essential to maintain
voltage on the fence

Maintaining a 10-inch
interval between the
lower wire and the soil
is essential for optimum
performance. Depressions,
drainage ditches and shallow
washouts give deer places
to enter without being
shocked

A keen observer of
deer behavior, Palmer
says that, without
electric shock this fence
fails to alter deer
behavior. Palmer
designed the Penn State
5-wire to be built with
electrified smooth wire
and exact spacings of
strands

The researchers
emphasize that
neglected maintenance
may result in deer
penetration and crop
damage. Deer often
know of electric failures
on the fence before
farmers do. When one
deer gets in, it may
bring others

Although there are
many new fences
available today,
Wingard and Palmer
feel the Penn State 5-
wire is one of the lowest-
cost, effective methods
of controlling deer
damage to agricultural
crops
