## Nest Run Eggs

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradable nest run eggs (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. **MARKET COMMENT:** RTC movement fairly good but noted as a little slower today in most quarters. While most plants are still able to clear production, some plants still carrying a little more product than before. Movement on parts is good as breasts and cutlets are generally short of current call while legs and wings are still moving but have become more available. Slaughter irregular but moderately heavy overall. Supplies fully adequate. Undertone steady.

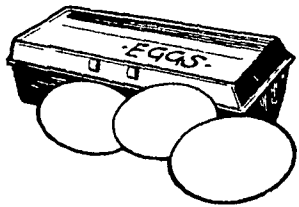
