Ask the Old Farmer: The white grout on the ceramic tile floor of our shower stall is turn-ing brown. We have tried all the grout cleaners on the market with no luck. Can you help? S.O., Chester, Va.

Bleach the grout with a mixture of lemon juice, ammonia, and water; rub into the grout with an old toothbrush. Or try white vinegar or alcohol — scrub the area and rub dry with an old towel.






