Top Angus showmen compete for nat'l title

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — Around 75 top showmen from across the United States will compete for the 1982 Angus showman title at the 16th National Angus Showmanship Contest, July 12-13, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

The first place winner will

receive \$150; second place, \$125; third, \$100; fourth, \$75; fifth, \$50; and sixth through remaining places, \$35. Also, the American Angus Auxiliary will award silver Revere bowls to the contest finalists.

Preliminary rounds of the 16th

national contest will begin at 3 p.m., July 12, with the finals set for noon on July 13.

The national event will take place at the state fairgrounds. It is featured in conjunction with the National Junior Angus Show.

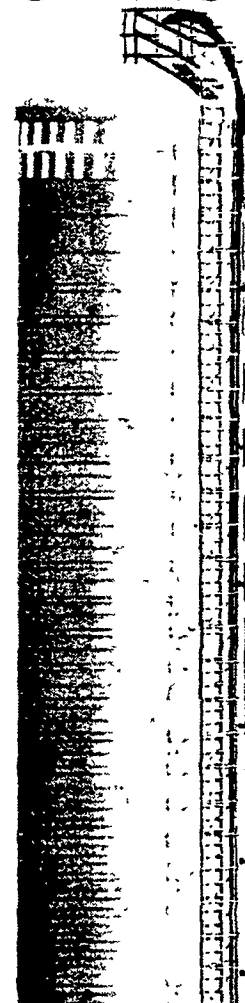
