Omaha Cattle Thursday, July 29

Report supplied by USDA Weekly 51 - Cattle: Through midweek Slaughter Steers and Heifers fully .50 lower, some .75-1.00 down. Cows .50-1.50 higher, most advance on Utility and commercial. Bulls steady.

Day-to-day prices trended unevenly through the week, as buyers sought to keep pace with an erratic beef trade. The market. ended the session however on a sour note Wednesday, when carcass prices declined broadly, forcing buyers to reduce bids and operate very cautiously. Best interest again focused on heavier weight choice offerings; consequently Steers under 1100 lbs. and Heifers 925 lbs. and down experienced discounts and a narrowed demand.

Steers made up 46 pct of the week's receipts; Heifers 41 pct., Cows 8 pct. and Feeders 3 pct. Four day receipts 7,979, last week 7,841; year ago 8,571.






