MARKET COMMENT: RTC movement on whole birds is fair for immediate needs. Advance interest improved for next week but predominantly on branded product. Movement on parts reported good with legs as best mover. Slaughter schedule fairly heavy. Live supplies fully adequate and weights generally desirable. Undertone steady but some unsettledness noted due to availability of product from other processing areas.
