Slaughter Bulls were 2.00-3.00 lower in limited supply with YG 11300-1725 lb. 48.05-49.90, one 1700 lb. high dressing bull topping at 52.00. Salable receipts this week estimated at 17,000 head compared with 19,516 head last week and 22,437 head last year. Bulk of this weeks receipts or 87 percent of estimated supply consisted of Feeder Cattle and Calves; Cows and Bulls made up 13 percent of receipts.
