Compared to Tuesday's 4:00 p.m. report: Steer and heifer beef steady, early, however steer beef hardly tested. Afternoon trading at a near standstill under light demand. Heifer beef under most pressure with a weak undertone late. Steer beef supply light for prompt ship, heifer beef moderate to heavy for demand. The boxed beef carcass cutout value advanced \$.90 to an estimated \$108.30 per cwt. Sales reported on 45 1/2 loads of steer and heifer beef.
