John Sherk, of Penn State's Agronomy Department, was on hand to explain the value of forage testing and to demonstrate the department's mobile infra-red forage analyzer. Sherk urged the group to use the available technology to obtain information readily on the nutritional value of forages and then integrate that knowledge into their management to help them make money.
