A few U.S. #1's sold for \$68.00-\$69.00 a hundredweight on Saturday, topping the old high of 68.00 at the Stockyards.

Although prices didn't reach that level during the week at the various Lancaster County auctions, they held firm in the mid-60's. This firmness gave rise to speculation that the \$70.00 barrier may finally be broken.
