BUTTERSCOTCH BROWNIES

1/4 c. butter

- 1 c. dark brown sugar
- 1 egg, unbeaten
- 1 t. vanilla
- 1/2 c. sifted enriched flour
- 1 t. baking powder
- 1/2 t. salt
- 1/2 c. broken nuts

Melt butter. Stir in brown sugar until dissolved. Cool slightly, then beat in egg and vanilla.

Mix and sift flour, baking powder, and salt. Stir in with nuts. Turn into greased 8x8 inch pan.

Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 25 to 30 minutes. Cut immediately into bars. Makes 16 or more bars. Have fun!

Satins - John Godfrey, Best of Breed and Best Opposite.



per person, or \$15 per couple, and may be purchased by calling Valerie Kanavy at (215)469-9253. Rain date is Aug. 29.


Cumberland4-H swine sale scheduled
