Pasture-livestock field day coming to s.w. Pa.

UNIVERSITY PARK
 - Pasture systems for cow-calf herds and backgrounding stocker cattle on high-quality pastures will be highlights of a Pasture-Livestock Field Day, September 2, at Penn State's Southwestern Field Research Laboratory, located near Rector in the Ligonier Valley off Route 711.

William C. Stringer, assistant professor of agronomy and project leader of the pasture-livestock program, says research and extension workers will be available to demonstrate and discuss many different aspects of managing pastures and livestock for more efficient production.

Wagon tours of the research pastures and plots will start at noon. Visitors will have an opportunity to examine pastures on different types of soil and of different mixes, including warm-season grasses and tall fescue.

Different types of fencing and watering facilities for cattle will be demonstrated at another stop on the tour. Specialists also will outline grazing management programs.

Hay harvesting, storage and feeding demonstrations will be held near the farm headquarters. And for those interested in improving their livestock breeding programs, specialists will discuss estrus synchronization and artificial as well as natural breeding programs.

Stringer says tours and demonstrations will be held from noon to about 5:00 p.m. At 5:30 p.m. there will be a corn boil sponsored by the Westmoreland County Cattlemen's Association. Meal reservations can be made by sending a \$3 check to the Westmoreland County Extension Fund, F.O. Box 250, Greensburg, PA 15601.
