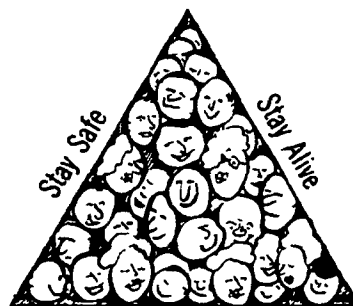

Legs & wings difficult to clear; breasts and cutlets holding their own but not clearing as well as before. Slaughter schedules moderately heavy. Live supplies ample and weight heavier than desired.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices on U.S. Grade A at 44 - 48 cents, with some lower prices where heavy product must be cleared. Undertone unsettled.

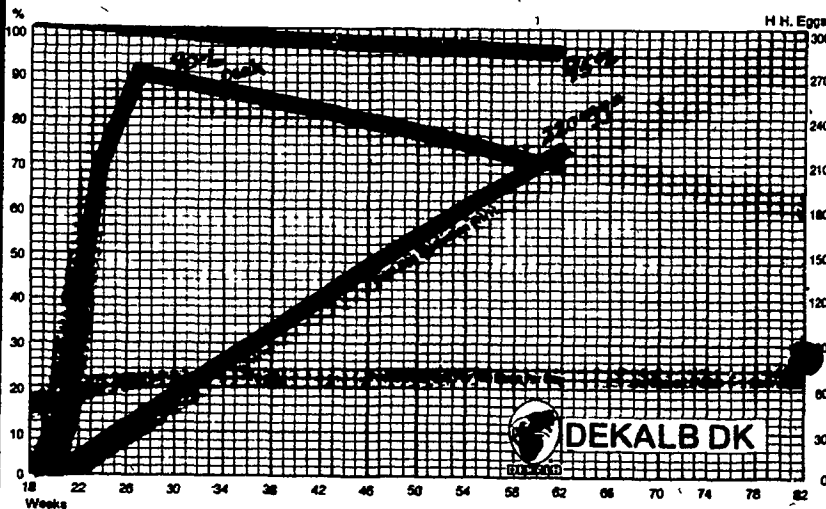
Estimated slaughter of broiler tryers in Delmarva (000).
