

# Bupplynn entry claims York Holstein championship

YORK — A three-year-old Marvex daughter took Senior and Grand Champion open class Holstein honors at the York Fair for Bupplynn Farms, Seven Valleys.

Bupplynn Marvex Patty, scored VG-86, also topped the Best Senior Bred and Owned class of the 150-head show, placed by judge John Morris, Maryland.

Reserve Senior and Grand, and second-placed Bred and Owned was Sunnybend Eloise Kit Triune, exhibited by Sunnybend Farm of York. The Tom Boyer family of Sunnybend also took another top spot, winning the Junior Champion

rosette with daughter Bridgette's 4-H intermediate calf by Sexation.

Taking the Reserve Junior championship was a junior yearling heifer by Edeal Pinonia Matt Tippy, exhibited by Philka Holsteins of Thomasville.

## Colored breed entries recapture York championships

YORK—Rutter Bros. of York retained their champion titles in Guernsey open class exhibiting at the York Fair, taking three of the top four awards.

Senior and Grand Champion was aged cow Eber Cindy Win Sandra, topping the Reserve winner, Rutter Bros. Favvors Buffy, a three year old. A senior yearling by Rutter Bros. Laddies Superior earned Junior Champion ribbons, over Reserve Darryl Rohrbauch with his second-place senior yearling by Rockmore Hornet Byron.

Rutter's topped several other classes, including Senior Calf, Aged Dry Cow, 4 Year Old, Best Udder, Best Senior Female, Bred and Owned, Best 3 Females and Dairy Herd.

Honey crest Farm of Hellam, also took several first placings, including Junior Yearling, Dry Cow 3 & 4 Junior 2 Year Old, Produce of Dam and Dam & Daughter class.

Single blue ribbon wins went to Phil Laughman's junior calf, Lorie Kessler's intermediate, and a senior two year old exhibited by

Hidden-Springs farm.

In the Jersey competition, Mildred Seeds swept the show's placings, topping off with champion Top-O-Hill Milestone Tempty. The winning three-year-old went Excellent her first scoring at two years and has at least 15 champion rosettes in her distinguished young career. Top-O-Hill also won the Reserve Grand, Junior and Reserve Junior awards.

Other lone Jersey blue ribbons went to Sue Eisenhart's in-
