Receiving premiums in the 4-H and FFA dairy divisions were: James Cappucci, Jr., Mehoopany, third-place Holstein senior calf, fourth-place senior showman, and fifth-place senior fitter.

In the open class Lightweight Market Lamb section, first place went to Marion and Richard Brunges.

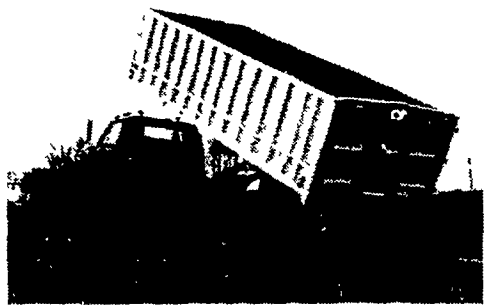

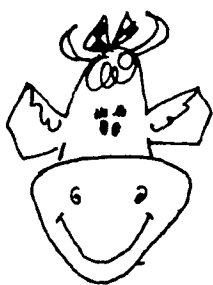

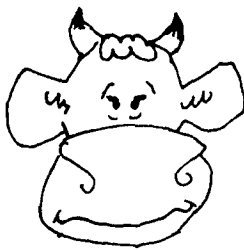
