Today's L.T.L. asking prices higher on U.S. Grade A at 46-50 cents.

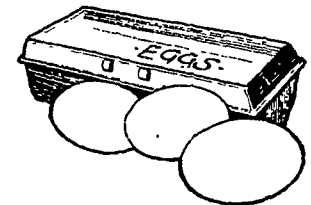

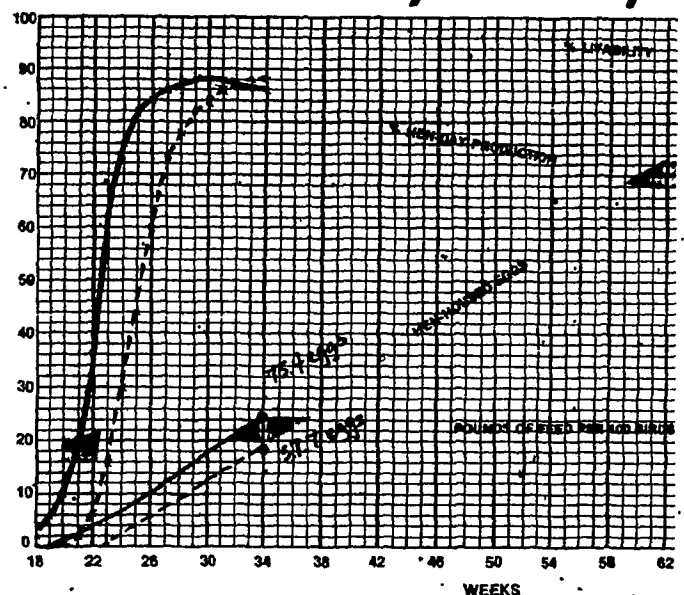
