problem in strawberries for a number of years. Crown injury can be reduced by applying mulch to protect them for winter. The best time for application is from mid-November to mid-December. The exact date depends on weather conditions. But a good rule of thumb is to apply mulch when the temperature begins to stay around 20 to 25 degrees F. If it drops to 15 degrees or lower, unprotected strawberry crowns could be injured. In any case, it's a good idea to mulch the plants after they have been exposed to a few good freezes. Mulching is a very good practice to insure a better crop next summer.
