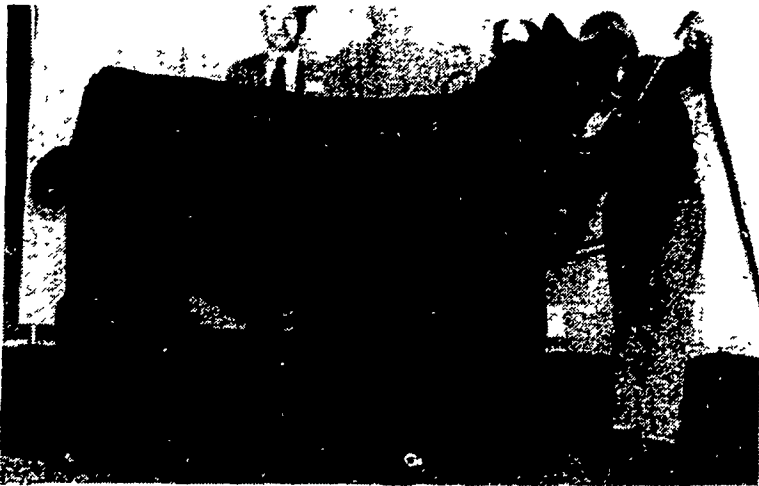


“Henry” repeats KILE Angus victory



Diane Krause of Lehigh County is at the halter of her Reserve Champion Angus heifer, DSK Grand Erica 281. The early summer yearling, bred to PS Power Play, is joined in the winner's circle by show judge Randall Updike and Angus Queen Tammy Eisenhower.



This senior bull calf champ continued his winning ways and claimed the Reserve Grand Champion Angus Bull title. Sired by Sayre Patriot and out of Ankony Queen Mother, the young bull is owned by Cecil Teets of Beaver County. Joining the reserve champ in the ring from left, are judge Randall Updike, Robert Sickler and Clifford Teets at halter.

HARRISBURG — A Lehigh County-bred bull rolled to his second straight KILE grand championship, during the Angus competition, Tuesday.

Pat-Ric's Henry, owned by Kyburg's Black Angus and Pat-Ric's Farm, Lyons, N.Y. and bred by the Salezze family of Germansville, racked up his seventh Grand Champion title in his second year on the show circuit.

The 2-year-old SWA Ideal Marathon son, out of Heinzman Onyx Onager, coasted to the title following his Senior Bull Champion

win.

In all, Pennsylvania animals filled the majority of the champion slots.

Cecil Teets, a Beaver County breeder steered his November 1961 bull calf to the Senior Bull Calf title and then followed up with a Reserve Grand Champion Bull win. Tuesday's contest was the young bull's tanbark debut.

Sired by Sayre Patriot, Seldom Seen MR Perfect is out of Ankony Queen Mother. Before the contest ended, Teets earned both Premier Breeder and Exhibitor titles.

Diane Krause of Slatington, Lehigh County collected the Reserve Champion Heifer title with her June 1981 heifer DSK Grand Erica 281, a General JJ Patton daughter. The heifer is bred to PS Power Play.

Show judge Randall Updike from Ohio State University went with a September 1981 heifer for grand champion. Millcreek Joy, sired by Alberta Jumbo GR, got the winning tap and is owned by Brian Hutchins of West Mansfield, Ohio.
