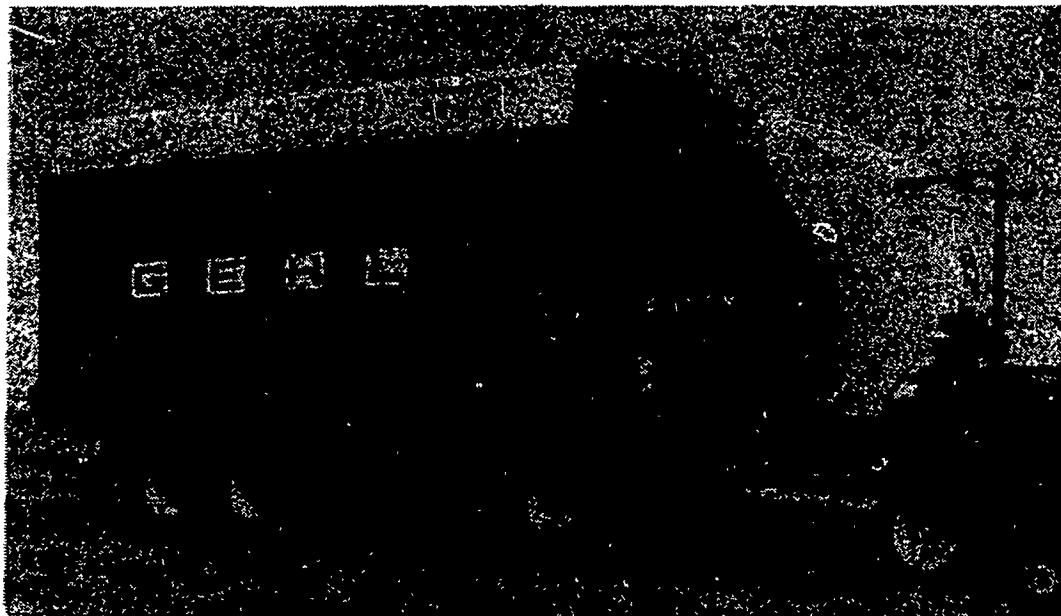


Northampton Holstein and DHIA members hold joint meeting

Milk production up

HARRISBURG — Milk production in Pennsylvania during October 1982 totaled 773 million pounds, up three percent from a year earlier according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The number of milk cows in the Commonwealth during October averaged 736,000 head, up 9,000 from a year ago. Milk production per cow averaged 1,050 pounds in October, up 20 pounds from a year ago.
