The first place Jr. ewe lamb advanced to be recognized as the Grand Champion Ewe. She is owned by Mark and Dale Smith of Crawfordsville, IN. Reserve Champion Ewe privileges were granted to Howard and Harral Southdowns of Mulhall, OK, with their second placer Jr. ewe lamb.



relative low cost of poultry meat as compared with beef. But, the big annual percentage gains in broiler consumption experienced in the past are not likely to occur again, he savs.

"Turkey consumption per person may continue for some time at a reasonable increase because a 10 percent gain in per capita consumption would only be a pound increase in turkey consumption," Birth says. A 10 percent change in pork production is equivalent to 6.5 pounds per person, while a 10 percent gain in broiler consumption would be almost 5 pounds.

"Further gains in per capita consumption of poultry meat will likely be at the expense of other meats," Birth concludes. "The growth in total meat consumption per person has in all probability leveled off."
