

Gruber wins **Extension** award

UNIVERSITY PARK - Henry A. W. Gruber of R2, New Tripoli, has been named recipient of the 1982 Friends of Extension Award presented by the Pennsylvania chapter of Epsilon Sigma Phi, national honorary Extension fraternity.

Gruber was honored at the chapter's annual meeting last Wednesday on Penn State main campus. He was cited for his contributions to the Cooperative Extension Service and the Commonwealth's agricultural industry.

County Extension director, who presented the award, pointed out that Gruber, in charge of procurement for Arbogast and Bastian Meat Packing Company, Allentown, has purchased about \$2 million worth of 4-H animals at various state sales.

He has served on more than 21 different agricultural committees, both state and local. He was president of the Lehigh County Extension Association and chairman of the Lehigh County agricultural committee. For his

Alletta Schadler, Lebanon outstanding service to agriculture, he was elected by the Penn State College of Agriculture faculty to honorary membership in Gamma Sigma Delta, honor society in agriculture. In 1982, he was named distinguished alumnus in livestock at Penn State.

Gruber has been a director of the Pennsylvania Livestock Association, serving on the committee for youth activities and the research and development committee. For his service to the livestock industry, he was named Livestock Man of the Year in 1978.

The award winner has been a member of the executive committee of the Pennsylvania Meat Animal Evaluation Center at Penn State. This committee sets policies. for performance testing of beef cattle, sheep, and seine in Pennsylvania.
