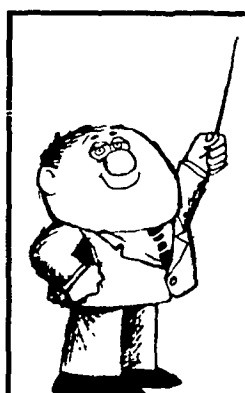
Venison can spoil quickly

HARRISBURG—Hunters are urged by the Game Commission to take proper care of or have their deer processed as quickly as possible to prevent spoilage during warm weather. Skinning out the animal also helps reduce the chance of spoilage.

Some thought should be given to the spot where a deer is hung. In recent years, a number of deer hanging from camp poles were stolen or eaten by hungry bears.

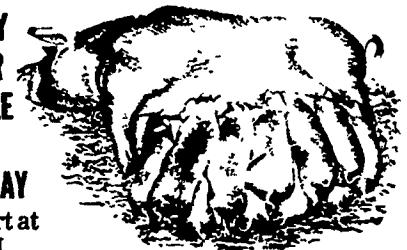
