Bulls firm with YG 1 few 2 1500-1825 lb. 47.60-50.80, instances 52.00; 1000-1425 lb. 45.75-56.25. Some low dressing 39.75-42.75. Beneficial, substantial rains over Oklahoma had a bullish effect on cattle prices. Salable receipts this week estimated at 18,000 head compared with 5,792 head the holiday shortened week ago and 17,272 head last year. Bulk of

receipts consisted of Feeder Cattle and Calves; Cows and Bulls made up 11 percent of the estimated supply.

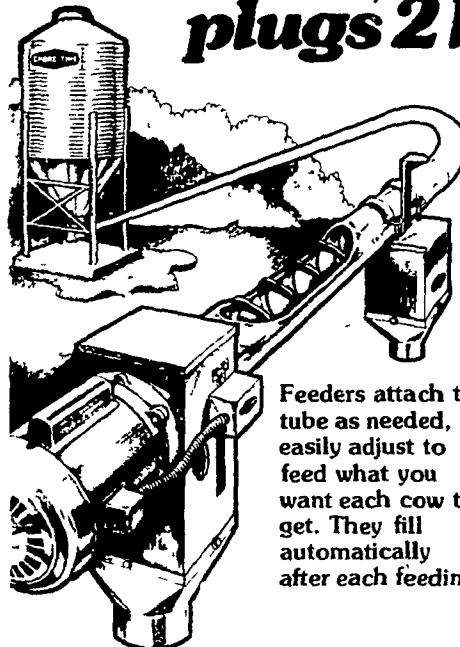
