NAILE tags Shorthorn champs

OMAHA, Neb. — Grand Champion Shorthorn bull at the 1982 North American International Livestock Show at Louisville, Kentucky, was Honey Dew Big Red, a two-year-old son of WO Divident 3J.

This bull has been a consistent winner at summer shows and most recently was named Grand Champion bull of the American Royal, Kansas City, Mo. He also was the Senior Champion bull and is owned and exhibited by Jerry Taylor and Family, Prairie City, Il., and Martin Bros., Hardyville,

Ky.

Reserve Grand Champion bull was GM Irish Special, a big, red two-year-old son of Lazy D. Irish Jack. He is owned and shown by Sutherland Farms, Prospect, Ky., and Hagerlan Farms, Hodgenville, Ky. He also was the Reserve Senior Champion bull.

In the female show, Mill Brook Hope 81 was named Grand Champion and Junior Champion female. This late spring yearling is a daughter of Deerpark Improver 2 and was shown by Mill Brook Shorthorns, Rob Johnson,

Fredericktown, Oh. She had previously won the Shorthorn female show at the American Royal.

Reserve Grand Champion female was SS Idle Ruth B481, a daughter of Lancer. She was also the Calf Champion female and is owned by Sherer's Shorthorns, Fowler, In.
