We urge all farmers to check on their feeding practices to be sure that every pound of grain or hay is being consumed by the animals. Grain or hay tramped into the manure is wasteful and costly. Don't permit it to happen on vour farm.

Pa. distributes wrong mushroom data

HARRISBURG - The state's Mushroom Promotions Program today said that copies of a pamphlet entitled "Fresh Pennsylvania Mushrooms," distributed recently, contains outdated information on home canning procedures.

The pamphlet states, "A boiling water bath of 212 degrees F. or 100 degrees C. for 15-20 minutes can be used (to process mushrooms for canning)." William Piper, coordinator of the program, cautioned that this process is NOT RECOMMENDED and should not be used. He explained that the process can cause spoilage.

According to Piper, the pamphlet was circulated during the Farm Show, at Strawberry Square on Jan. 19 during the State Mushroom Cook-Off Contest, and

at Giant Food Stores in Carlisle on Jan. 21.


Piper said that current information and procedures for home canning of mushrooms has been included in a revised edition of the pamphlet, which is now available.

Anyone who received a copy of the pamphlet and who wishes an updated copy with proper procedures for preparing mushrooms, for home canning or freezing should wirte "Fresh Pennsylvania Mushrooms,' Bureau of Markets, Pa. Dept. of Agriculture, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110

Piper recommended that anyone wishing to can mushrooms at home contact the Agriculture Department's Bureau of Foods and Chemistry or the County Extension Office.


