IN spite of declines in the dressed beef trade, live prices held on a firm note, as buyers were forced into at least minimum purchases from the light salable numbers. The character of the receipts proved consistent with recent weeks, as muddy cattle and "short feds" again constituted a large percentage of the total. Slaughter Cow prices advanced sharply, even though numbers of these kinds the largest in some time.

Steers comprised 45 pct of week's receipts: Heifers 36 pct; cows 15 pct; Feeders 3 pct. Four day receipts 10,685, Week Ago 7.082, Last Year 12,758.
