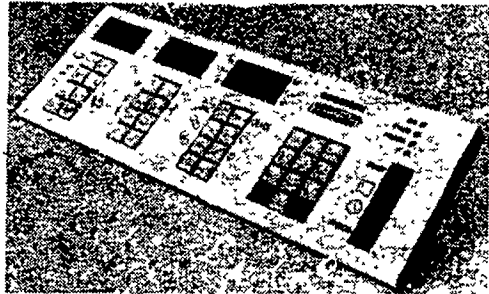

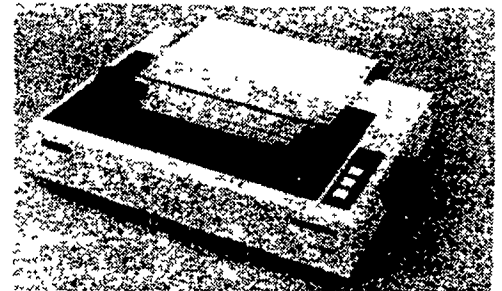

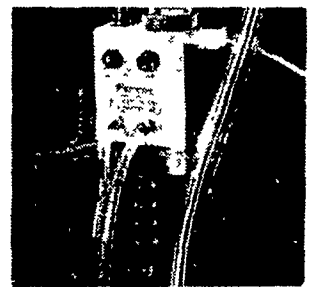

MODEL L

- CODATRON feed program with 24-hour cycle (24 intervals)
- Input and readout of feed amounts in lbs.
- Maximum amount limit in each interval
- Simple checking of problem cows (more than 9% residual feed)
- Stored data preserved in the event of power failure
- Optional automatic or manual start of the feeding program
- Feeding program extensible to max. 560 cows
- Connections for up to 16 automatic feeders
- Printer connection
- Choice of one or two types of feed
- Additional reading of
 - contents of silo tank
 - daily consumption
 - daily consumption per feeding box (for all types of feed)
- A percentual increase or reduction of the daily feed ration can be implemented for the whole herd (changes in the quality of the feed).
- Model L also includes Cow Calendar
 - input of calving date
 - heat date input
 - breeding date
 - determination of lactation stage
 - input of date of dry time
 - start of concentrate feeding before calving
- The control panel already has the functions for milking parlour operation (storage of the various data for each cow).

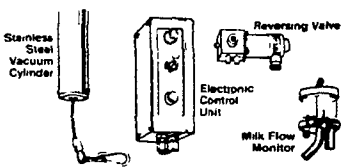
