The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Benner, Irene owns 13 head in the family's Santee Acres herd at the Millerstown R2 farm. She's a member of the Perry Dairy 4-H club, the Junior Holstein club and an eighth grader at Greenwood High School.

In 1980, Irene won first place in an essay contest on "Why the Family Farm Should Last Forever," and was cited by Penn State's television "What's in the News" contest.

Ross Hershberger-is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Hershberger of Martinsburg. A six-year veteran of working with Holsteins in Junior project and 4-H work, the young Bedford Countian has bred six of the 14 registered animals he owns in the family's Eldacross herd.


