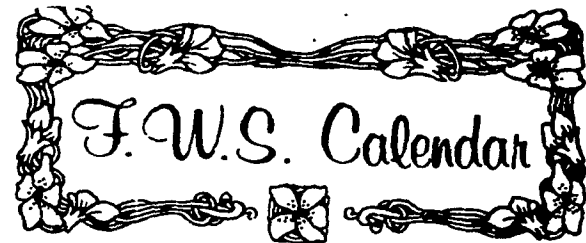


Chester sheep talks Wednesday

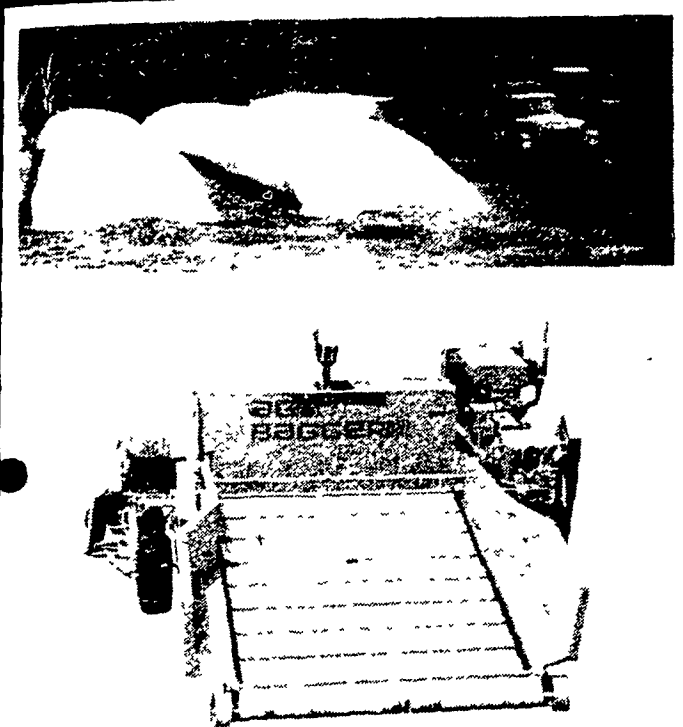

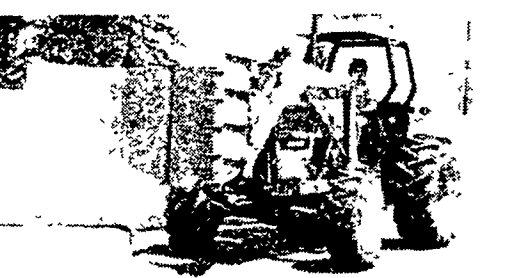

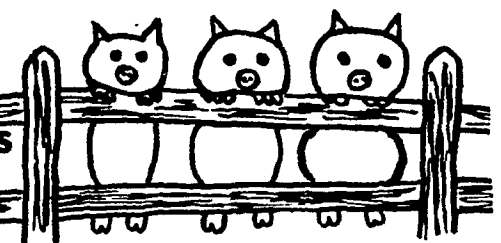
