Report supplied by USDA Slaughter Steers and Heifers ended the week .20-.50 higher. Cows 2.00-3.00 higher. Bulls steady.

What little zest noted in fed cattle trading mainly attributed to continuing short live inventories in packer hands. Trading generally a forced business with most buying being done to satisfy immediate slaughter needs. An early week upturn in the dressed beef trade vanished at mid-session and a bearish tone prevailed at the close of fed cattle trading. Mud continued to present problems in the trade although dressing percentages showed some provement. Cows moved sharply higher as country movement decreased and dressed prices climbed 3.00-6.00.
