Poultry course on April 6

The program will cover a variety of topics in the hatchery and breeder flock areas. Ed Odor, University of Delaware, will talk about killed reovirus vaccines for broiler breeders. Fred Moultrie, of Kennebec Breeders will discuss genetic selection and tradeoffs in breeder development.

Larry Cogburn will explain the relationship between chicks' dietary level and temperature preference. Perrie Waters of Holly Farms will moderate a panel discussion on sanitation and furnigation practices in hatcheries. Frank Wills, of Sterwin Labs, will provide an update on regulations regarding fumigants in hatcheries. R.W. Kiers, Mississippi State University, will explain the
