

Two top Cumberland Co. dairy awards

NEWVILLE — Rebecca Dyarman and Anita Cornman topped the show bill of the 27th Annual Cumberland County 4-H Dairy Club Banquet winning the top awards at the Monday evening event.

Rebecca, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Dyarman, was selected as the Outstanding 4-H Dairy Member of 1982. She received the award for seven years of club work, along with carrying three projects with an average score of 95.

Last year, Rebecca also exhibited the 4-H Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Holstein at the 4-H Round-up. She brought home to Cumberland County, honors from the Southcentral 4-H District Dairy Show winning the award of 4-H Grand Champion Holstein. And, at the 1982 Carlisle Fair, Rebecca was selected as one of two Experienced Dairy Showmen.

Winning the award of Outstanding First-Year 4-H Dairy member was Anita Cornman, daughter of Clarence Cornman Jr. Anita won this outstanding award

with a score of 96.5 on her project books, and was selected one of the top junior fitters and top junior showman of last year. Anita also won the Junior Dairy Judging contest at the 1982 Shippensburg Fair. She maintained a record of outstanding attendance at club meetings throughout 1982.

Two club members, Jennifer Reasner and Karis Greene, received honorable mention first-

year-member awards for their outstanding first-year work in the 4-H Dairy Club.

Jennifer Reasner is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jeff Reasner. Jennifer had one of the top project book scores of first-year members, was one of the top 4-H members in the Inexperienced Showman Division and attended all the club meetings.

Karis Greene, daughter of Mr.

Haydee Greene, also winning an honorable mention first-year member award had one of the top project scores, was selected as top Junior Inexperienced Showman of the 1982 Carlisle Fair, participated in the Pretty Calf Contest at the Carlisle Fair and maintained outstanding attendance.

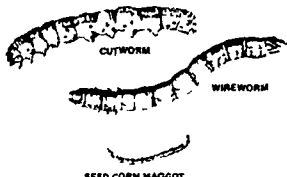
