

Dairy cattle judging today at Penn State

UNIVERSITY PARK — Penn State Dairy Science Club members are preparing for the 58th Annual Dairy Exposition to be held this spring. Events include the Dairy Cattle Judging Exposition to be

held this spring. Events include the Dairy Cattle Judging Contest today, the Dairy Princess Contest on April 27, and "Show Day" on May 7. Overall chairman of the Dairy

Exposition is David Naugle, senior in dairy production from R1 Hooversville. Assistant overall chairman is David Trotter, junior in dairy production from R1, Enon Valley.

Today's Dairy Cattle Judging Contest began at 9 a.m. at the university dairy barns. The contest will involve young people from statewide 4-H and FFA clubs, as well as amateur and professional collegiate judges from Penn State.

This year's cattle judging contest is chaired by Lisa Cooper, senior in dairy production from R1, Slippery Rock. Co-chairman is Alan Kozak, junior in dairy production from R8, Washington.

"The contest gives 4-H, FFA, and collegiate individuals a good opportunity to gain experience in judging and evaluating the conformation of dairy cattle," chairman Cooper stated, adding that "we encourage young people throughout the state to participate."

Today's event includes eight classes to be judged by all participants. In addition, the professional collegiate division will have four oral reasons classes and the 4-H and FFA division will have two oral reasons classes. Amateur collegiate entrants will not have reasons classes. Classes will be judged in the morning with reasons in the afternoon. Twelve official Penn State alumni judges will place the classes and score the oral reasons.

Awards for high individuals and teams in each division will be presented at an awards banquet May 7, beginning at 6 p.m. at

Gatsby's Restaurant in State College. The annual banquet is sponsored by the Dairy Science Club.

The Dairy Princess Contest April 27 is being organized by last year's Princess, Judith Harding, of R4, Brookville. Miss Harding is a sophomore in dairy production. Any girl in the Penn State Dairy Science Club is eligible to compete. Selection is based on speaking ability, appearance, personality, poise, and service in the College of Agriculture.

The 1983 Dairy Exposition concludes with "Show Day" on May 9 at the Penn State dairy barns. About 115 cows from the University dairy herds will be fitted and shown by Penn State students. This year's show manager is Don Snyder, senior in agricultural economics and rural sociology from Pitman. Assistant manager is James Hoge, junior in dairy production from Pittsburgh.

Also planned for "Show Day" are special events. These include a celebrity milking contest, fraternity and individual milk "chugging" competition, sorority and individual milking contests and a calf dressing contest. This part of the Dairy Exposition is organized by Dave Lash, junior in dairy production of R1, West Newton. His assistant is Suzanne Voight, sophomore in agriculture from Lafayette, N.J.

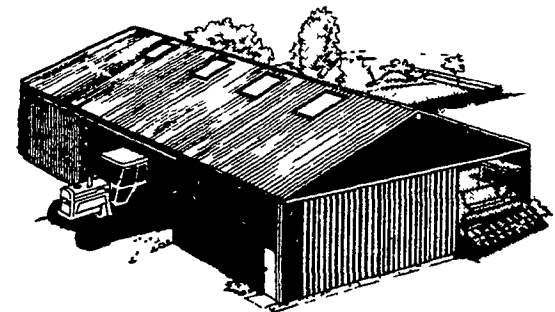
