Compared to previous week's close slaughter steers ended this week 1.00 higher, while heifers advanced 50 cents to mostly 1.00. Cows steady to 2.00 lower. Bulls steady.
Fed cattle prices continued on an upward course despite fairly liberal terminal receipts, a 21 percent increase from last week;

pointing up the basic strength existing in the market. Most packer inventories were in fairly current shape, consequently day-to-day demand good. Carcass prices appreciated 1.00-1.50 through Wednesday while boxed beef realizations advanced 2.53 cwt. Weather stressed cattle, mostly muddy, comprised a goodly share of the salable numbers and rain-show conditions in the trade area this week ruled out much immediate relief.

Steers comprised 41 pct of the week's receipts; Heifers 33 pct., Cows 3 pct; Feeders 22 pct. Four day receipts 12555, week ago 9856, last year 8087.
