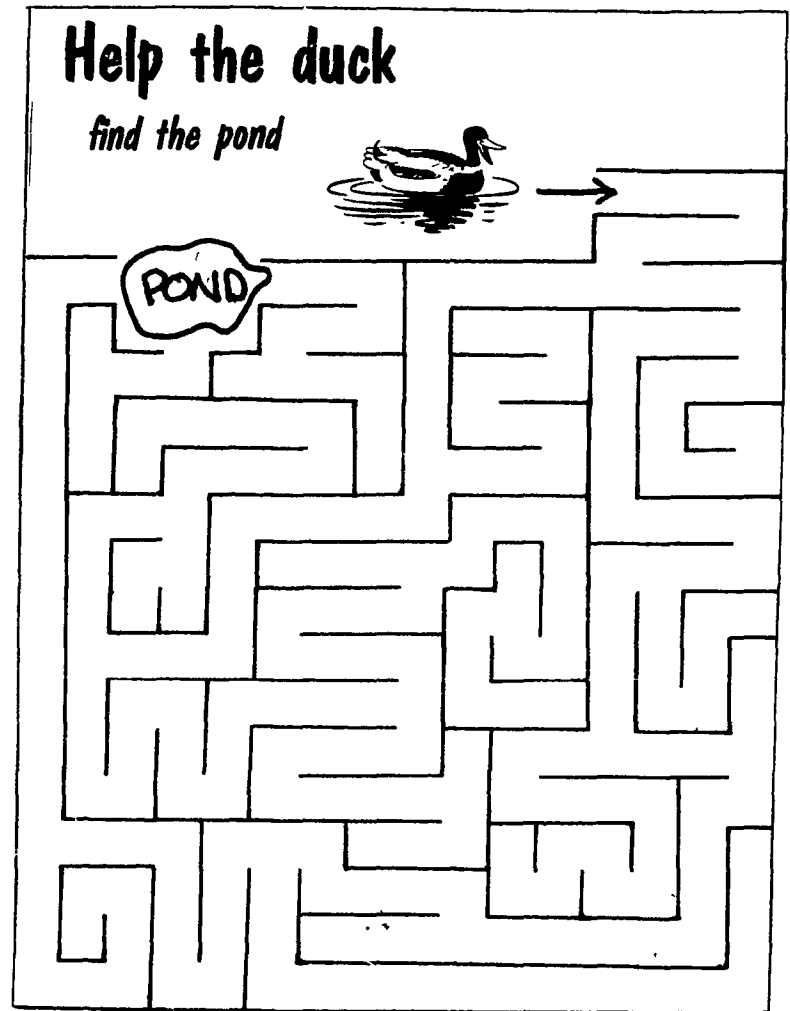


Kid's Korner
