

Clean and green amendment ready for Gov. signature

HARRISBURG — The amendment to the Clean and Green Act permitting a one-time split-off use of up to two acres of farmland for ag-related commercial purposes, which passed the House last week, was awaiting the Governor's signature this week.

Senate Bill 380, which amends the Clean and Green Act, permits the split-off of land enrolled in the Preferential Tax Assessment Program for commercial marketing of ag products without the penalty of rollback taxes on the entire farm.

The two-acre commercial split-off is still subject to local zoning ordinances and use-related taxes though.

The commercial development of marketing facilities is limited to the farm owners.

In other ag-related legislative matters in Harrisburg:

—Senate Bill 402 dealing with oil and gas leases has been reported out of the Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committee. Some minor amendments were added to the bill.

—Interest is being shown among a number of House members in a bill being advanced by the State Grange to require the bonding of poultry processors and brokers. It has resulted from the recent Mandata Poultry bankruptcy, which has affected some 60 broiler growers in the state.

—A meeting was also scheduled for this week with the PUC concerning aerial spraying along utility rights-of-way.

The Grange reports that recommendations concerning the resumption of aerial spraying by West Penn Power Company in Fayette County have been favorably received by the company, PDA and the consumer advocate.

The spraying would be resumed under certain guidelines, which give land owners the option to perform the work along utility rights-of-way themselves and then be reimbursed by the utility. Also, there would be guidelines concerning spraying in the vicinity of certain areas, such as ponds and crops.

Del. holds spring dairy goat show

HARRINGTON, DE — The second officially ADGA sanctioned Dairy Goat Spring Show drew exhibitors from a large area. The show sponsored by the Delaware Dairy Goat Association attracted many exhibitors from Maryland, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, and Virginia.

Delaware Dairy Goat Association, Ms. Vickers said that they were very pleased with the success of the show and plan to continue holding the show in May every year. The association is pleased that all the exhibitors wanted to be put on the entry list for next year's spring show.

Another little buck shown was representing a California breeder. The buck had recently been purchased for over \$2000.

Mr. Howard Deakne of Rolla, Missouri, said he was very surprised at the excellent quality of animals on the Eastern Shore. He was also surprised at the approximately 250 animal turnout for the show.

Ms. Vickers reported that Judge Deakne did an excellent job, his reasons were easy to follow as were his placings. The Judge took time after the show to discuss animals and what could be improved on with each one. She said the exhibitors were pleased with the state fairground facilities, being well suited for the show, with all the pens and the show under one roof.

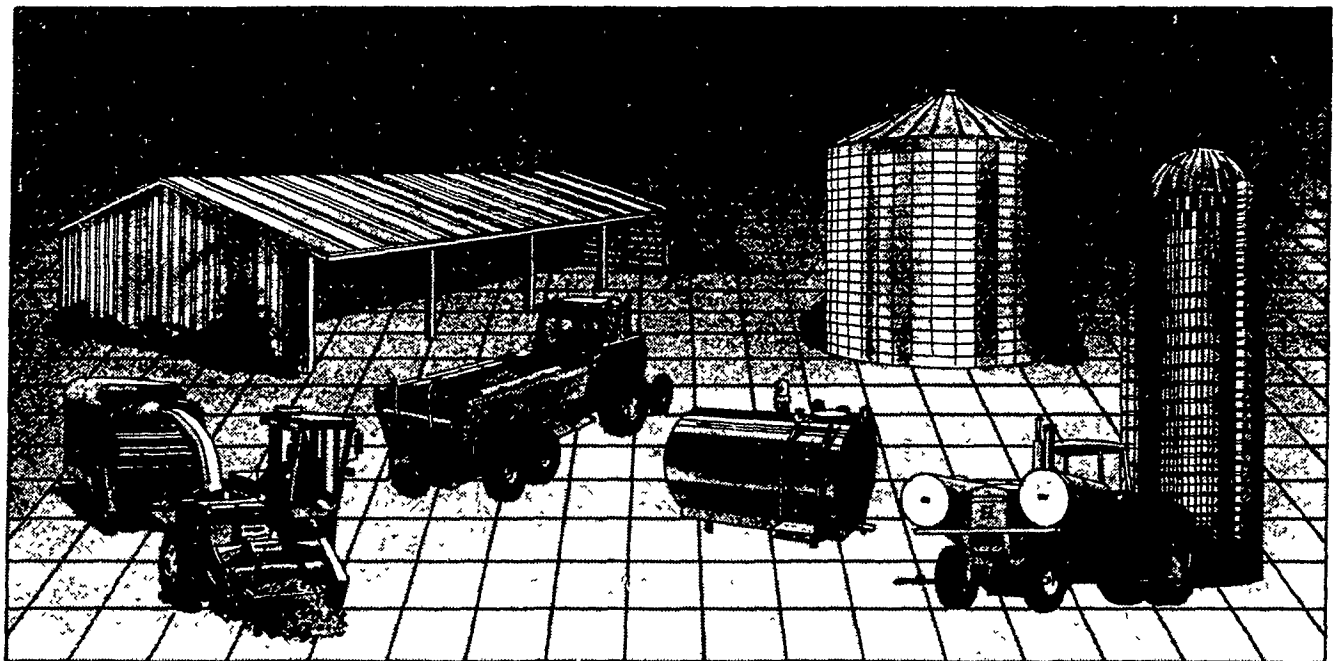

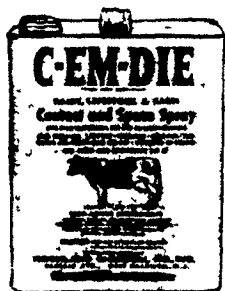
