HARRISBURG - Heavy enrollment in the regular Acreage Reduction and Payment-In-Kind (PIK) Programs means large cutbacks in 1983 crops. Feed Grain production will likely fall to the lowest levels since the mid-1970's, and wheat output could reach a four-year low. Cattle numbers on January 1 declined about 400,000 head from a year earlier, abruptly halting the rise in the cattle cycle. Hog producers had expanded their inventories faster than expected, but higher grain prices because of PIK may slow or halt production increased in 1984.


