## **Top Pa. horse breeders are honored**

KENNETT SQUARE - Pennsylvania's overall leading breeder of thoroughbreds in 1982 was George Strawbridge Jr., whose Augustin Stable homebreds last year earned \$380,571.

Strawbridge, of Cochranville, Chester County, was honored by Pennsylvania Horse Breeder's Association at its fourth annual Iroquois Awards Banquet on Thursday at Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square.

Strawbridge has bred and raced an extraordinary number of flat and steeplechase stakes winners and has headed the list of U.S. steeplechase owners for eight of the past nine years. His trainer, Jonathan Sheppard of West Grove, Chester County, has led all trainers every season since 1973.

PHBA's award for the breeder of the leading Pennsylvania-bred money winner went to C. Thomas Fuller, breeder of Ambassador of Luck, a winner of \$166,972 in 1982 and \$232,141 in two years of racing. A four-year-old by What Luck -Detente, by Dark Ruler, Ambassador of Luck last year won the

Martha Washington, Dutchess, Linda and Pinafore Stakes, bringing her record to seven wins (six stakes) in fifteen starts. Her breeder owns Winterwood, a thoroughbred farm in Unionville, Chester County, as well as Willowbrook Farms, a quarter horse operation in Catasauqua, Lehigh County.

Paul D. Mills, for the sixth consecutive year, receive PHBA's award for the leading recipient of awards from the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund. Mills last year garnered \$57,953 in breeder, owner and stallion awards, the most ever received by a single recipient in one year. PHBA vice president. Mills owns and operates Willow Tree Farm in Hellam, . York

County. Master of ceremonies for the Iroquois Awards Banquet was Al Meltzer, of Eclipse Award-winning WCAU-TV. Iroquois Awards, named in honor of the Pennsylvania-bred who was the first American-bred winner of England's Epsom Derby, will be presented to the breeders of all Pennsylvania-bred stakes winners


