Ask the Old Farmer: My dnftwood lamps are at least 20 years old and pieces of wood are beginning to chip off. I do not want to paint and gild them because I like the natural look. Is there some type of finish that will keep them from deteriorating? C.F., Belleville, NJ

If there is no finish on them now, try a coat of linseed oil Mix two parts boiled linseed oil to one part turpentine. This will soak into the wood and help to preserve it. The color of the wood will change slightly. Do it




