
Try these word twisters

Cookies are probably the most popular snack for youngsters, so here are several types that you quickly can learn to make yourself.

GUMDROP SQUARES

4 eggs

2 c. firmly packed brown sugar . 1 T. water

2 c. sifted cake flour


1/8 t. salt

1 t. baking powder

1 t. cinnamon 1 c. tiny mixed gumdrops, fresh

½ c. nuts Beat eggs until light. Add brown sugar gradually and water.

Continue beating until blended. Add flour, which has been sifted with salt, baking powder and



cinnamon.

Spread batter ½ inch thick in greased, floured pan. Bake in 350 degree oven for 30 minutes.

Cut into squares. Makes about 18 to 24 bars.

COCONUT BUTTER CHEWS

3/4 c. butter

34 c. shredded coconut

3 egg whites, beaten powdered sugar

21/4 c. firmly packed brown sugar

3 T. sugar

11/2 c. sifted enriched flour

3 egg yolks, beaten


1 c. chopped nuts

Cream butter; add white sugar, and blend with flour. Pat in bottom of greased pan.

Bake in 350 degree oven for 15 minutes.

Add brown sugar to beaten egg yolks. Add nuts and coconut. Stir in stiffly beaten egg whites and spread over first mixture. Return to oven for 25 to 30 minutes.

Dust with powdered sugar. Cut any desired size.
