—agree to participate in Brown Swiss activities as requested by the state for one year.

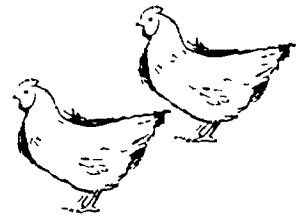
The National Convention will be held this year in Pennsylvania, so the new Swiss Miss will be quite active.
