Slaughter steer and heifer prices at the close Wednesday averaged steady with previous weeks close. Cows and bulls steady.

Although losses in the dressed beef trade dictated weaker packer bids, buyers of two-way steers, for the third consecutive week, sup-

ported prices in the sagging market. Numerous loads of cattle suitable for this trade were marketed through the week; consequently overall finish was less attractive than recent sessions. Prices bolstered also by the fact that packer inventories ran generally on the short side and purchases were being made for close-up slaughter.

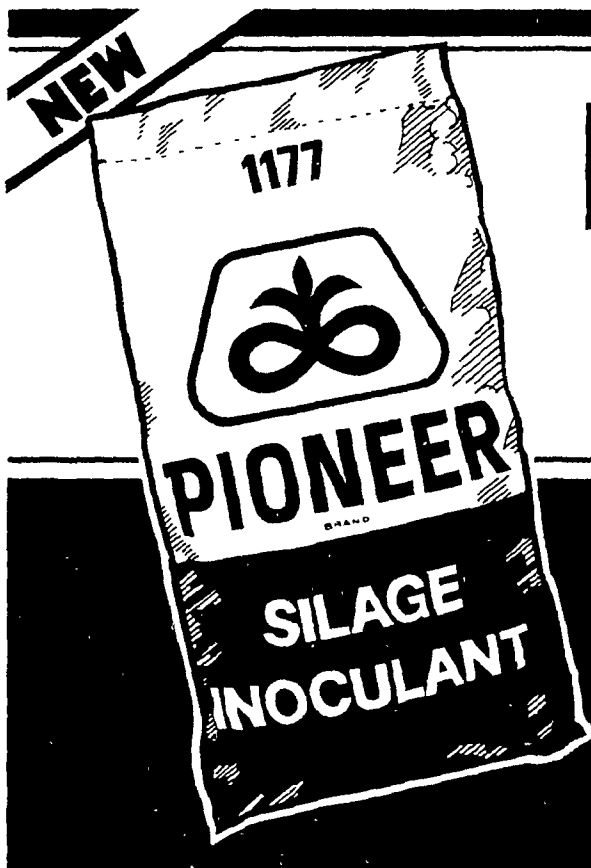
