

## Montgomery SCS gets no-till drill

NORRISTOWN - The Montgomery County Conservation District will be leasing a 10-footwide Tye no-till Drill for no-tilling soybeans and re-seeding pastures and haylands. The drill will be available to Montgomery County landusers for a flat rate of \$10.00 per acre.

The USDA Soil Conservation Service (SCS) will be coordinating the scheduling of the no-till drill for the Conservation District. The **Conservation District Directors** teel that this will be an excellent

opportunity for Montgomery County farmers to re-seed those pastures and haylands that they were afraid to plow due to the hazard of excessive erosion.

The no-till drill will also provide crop farmers an opportunity to try no-till soybeans after barley and wheat.


NEW HOLLAND — The New Holland Baby Beef 4-H Club met recently at the home of Roy Weaver for a showmanship


