range in size from six inches square to 10 inches square. It must have sufficient graphic clarity to permit reduction in size.

The body of the logo should represent either agricultural land, the diversity of agricultural production or both. Difficult abstractions are discouraged.

Deadline for entries

The name, address and telephone number of the entrant must be contained in a sealed envelope secured to the reverse side of the artwork.

Entries must be received by 5 p.m. Friday, Aug. 12. Final judging will be completed by Friday, Sept. 2 and winners will be notified as soon thereafter as practicable.

Winning entries will become the sole possession of the Lancaster County Agricultural Preserve Board.

on dogs around the neck, between the toes, under his legs, and in and around the ears. When found, they should be pulled out carefully with small tweezers; do not yank them, or their mouth parts will be left in the skin and cause an infection. The regular flea and tick powders are very effective. You can also spray the dog's nest with the insecticide Sevin.


