



MARKET COMMENT: Prices edged higher for all sizes. Trade sediment relatively steady, but a cautiousness has developed as market values increased. Carton egg movement shifted to medium in some quarters as the large differential displaces the usual buying pattern. Supplies of large are beginning to accumulate while medium begin to move a little better.
